





GLENEAGLES SOARS TO NEW HEIGHTS

leneagles Country Club has a rich history of offering its members the best in country club living. Originated in 1984, Gleneagles has had a total commitment to providing top-notch golf, fitness and tennis facilities and a luxurious clubhouse for its members to kick back in and enjoy a fabulous cocktail or gourmet meal.

Located on 404 acres, Gleneagles will be home to a brand new golf course this November. This is a wonderful addition to an already outstanding club, whose first members included PGA Tour legends such as Doug Sanders, Sam Snead, Billy Casper, Gay Brewer, Bob Goalby and Doug Ford.

"Currently we are renovating the Legends golf course. We started in April of this year. It's about a seven-month process. We do anticipate opening the golf course back up on Thanksgiving," says Jason Bagwell, Director of Golf Course Maintenance at Gleneagles Club. "We're not just giving it a face lift. We're doing a complete renovation, which means we're starting from scratch," Bagwell explains. "We bulldozed the old golf course down to dirt and we started over. It's a \$5 million project, which consists of a brand

new design, new irrigation system, new pump station and all new drainage."

Bagwell points out the old golf course was flat and the landscape of the new course will be improved. "The greens on the old course were very small. The grass was out dated and now we're going to have a lot of new updated features, such as larger greens and larger tees to accommodate heavier play and more golfers," Bagwell adds. "We're going from a tropical scene, which is what we have on our Victory golf course. It has a lot of coconut and royal palm trees and a lot of color. On the new Legends course, we're going to have all native plants and trees like sabal palms, cypress trees, saw palmettos and everything native to Florida. A golfer will now have the chance here to play two different courses on the same property."

Gleneagles' other golf course, the Victory course, was renovated in 2006, so that combined with the new area to play will take golfing at this club to a new level. "The new golf course appeals to a wide variety of players. The tee selection the ladies will be playing is anywhere from 4,500 yards to 5,200 yards. And the men can play anywhere from 5,500 yards to all the way to 7,000 yards," Bagwell says. "A 7,000 yard golf course is championship yardage. It

should attract new members and accommodate all the members we already have."

Architect Kipp Schulties, at the helm of the project, has done a lot of courses all over the world, but he has a strong focus in Palm Beach County.

In addition to the golfingenhancement project, Gleneagles is already home to an award-winning tennis program, prime health and fitness facilities and a breathtaking clubhouse that offers two fullservice restaurants and lounges and posh banquet facilities. The club also has a great golf-pro shop that carries the latest in golfwear from DKNY Golf, Ralph Lauren, Jamie Sadock and Cutter and Buck to stylish Oka B flip-flops to sport for an afternoon lounging at one of Gleneagle's fabulous pools. Gleneagles also has seven satellite clubhouses with libraries to relax in, a computer lab to stay up to date with the latest technologies and billiard and card rooms to get your game on in.

Whether members want to keep their competitive edge on the golf course or tennis courts, catch some rays relaxing at the pool or meet up with friends for a cocktail at one of Gleneagle's lounges, there's no shortage of ways to live fabulously at this remarkable Delray Beach Club.

COMMUNITY SPIRIT GOING STRONG AT GLENEAGLES

s General Manager and COO of Gleneagles, Kraig Spina has brought a lot to the table in his seven years at the club, including the club's "Victory" course renovation in 2007 and the \$5 million reconstruction of the Legends golf course set for completion around Thanksgiving. But what Spina is most proud of is something intangible he believes sets Gleneagles apart from any other club in the

"Collectively, Delray and Boca Raton have some of the most beautiful clubs in the country and I think we're right up there with the best. Everybody has nice facilities like golf courses and beautiful tennis courts and phenomenal clubhouses," Spina says. "But what sets us apart is the warm, friendly small town environment we've created. There is no caste system in Gleneagles. It's a very homogeneous community. When a member joins this club, there's no social maze where they have to figure out where they belong. People don't ask you where you live. They don't ask you where you come from or which community you live in. That warm welcoming environment is really what sets us apart."

Constant communication with Gleneagles board, committees and membership are other assets Spina believes keeps the club thriving. "Bricks and mortar are the easy part, but what I'm proud of is we have one of the best management teams. I'll put our management team against any club," Spina says. "The average tenure of our team is still 12 years. I brought in our Director of Golf and our golf course maintenance. The rest of the staff has pretty much stayed here. I'm proud of the team we developed and how we harvested the talent from these people who have been here so long."

Spina, who has worked in the country club industry for 24 years running clubs in the Carolinas, Indonesia and Jakarta, also takes pride in being accessible to members.

"I'm out talking to members as often as I can be. They don't have to come to my office. That's what it's all about," Spina explains. "I love to take my tours around the club. I love to walk down to the tennis courts, I take a ride onto the golf course. I like the membership here. They're wonderful people."


But something he's continually inspired by is just how big Gleneagles' members' hearts are. "We're so proud of our charity work here. In one Play for Pink golf tournament, we raised \$210,000," Spina recalls. "When the Haitians had the catastrophe in their country, our members wanted to help out without even being asked. Our members have a very philanthropic mind-set. They like to help people. When we need volunteers for events, we run out of space. That's the kind of caring and giving back they show us."

When he's not running Gleneagles, you can find Spina golfing, fishing, spending time with his family or racing his Subaru out on the track. But getting up every morning and returning to a job he truly loves is the





"One of the greatest things about this club is it's all about taking care of the members with day-to-day operations and that's what I enjoy. We put 100 percent into making sure our golf shop, teaching clinics, leagues, tournaments and facility are excellent."

NO 'I' IN TEAM:


"I love bouncing ideas off our staff and golf professionals from tournaments to different items in our pro shop. We want to make sure we do whatever we need to fit our members' needs."


TALK OF THE TOWN:

"To be doing a complete renovation with a driving range, full irrigation, and wall-to-wall turf is great. To work with Kipp Schulties, the golf course architect, is amazing. He's one of the best. To see what he has transformed already out there is absolutely amazing. It's going to be unlike any course. By having the Legends course and the Victory course, you have two different tastes. You have much more of a challenge, more yardage or you have the Victory course which is not as long in yardage but it's a little bit tighter with more precision on your shots and not as long in distance."

ON PAR PROGRAMS:

"We discuss training for golf in the fitness center, but one of the biggest things we do is our committees. We work with our ladies committees for their nine and 18 hole leagues and the men's. We thrive on many tournaments here from a Gleneagles Cup Match to a Club Championship to a great mixed member guest event that brought in members from other clubs to showcase our facility. We do a great event here, Play for Pink. This year it's going to be Feb. 7, with Mrs. Budow and Mrs. Goodman, and it's going to be fabulous. Then there's another event with Eagles Cancer Chapter that's great as well. These people love to play golf. Whether it's nine or 18 holes, our couples events have over 100 people for every one of them."

Experience at Gleneagles: 15 years

ACING IT:

"We have 21 courts with a great design. We have a main stadium court where we'll have exhibitions and different pros to entertain the members. The other courts are combined in two-court batteries with canopies and water. Not every club has that. It's laid out very nicely. They're Har-Tru courts."

SIGNATURE TENNIS MOVE:

"Pick the best doubles partner that will play with you."

TENNIS TIP:

"You get in shape to play. You don't play to get in shape. It's a physical game. Technically speaking, footwork is something people don't concentrate enough on. I don't do grips. You train your body as a whole. And you have to train the mind. It's a very cerebral game, much like managing a golf game. You have to manage your tennis court. Anyone can learn the strokes from a good instructor but these are the intangibles that often get overlooked."

COURTING CELEBRITIES:

"Ivan Lendl lived here. He played the US open with a Gleneagles label on his shirt. We had two grass courts behind the stadium and it was the only courts he practiced on. After Ivan left, Steffi Graf came and she happened to be No. 1 in the world at the same time. So we had two No. 1's in the world back to back. Steffi lived here and she worked out with our Head Pro Astrid Suurbeek, who is a world-class player. She's played all of the grand slam tournaments like Wimbledon in Australia. Chris Evert has also done some things here. I also held a celebrity event with Muhammad Ali and Bernie Kopell from "The Love Boat."

MEMBERS FIRST:

"I have a tennis committee that's also my eyes and ears to members' needs. We have a tennis concierge system. When new members join here, I'll take them by the hand and myself or my head pro Astrid will set them up personally with a group to play in. We'll hit with them first and evaluate them to make sure they end up in the right group. We make sure they don't get lost. We're always making games for them."

ROLE CALL:

"Teaching lessons as a tennis pro is one of the hats I wear. The marketing phase and entertaining of our members is paramount. There are a lot of socials and activities. Typically, the more food I have with the event, the more successful the event is! There's two things I've learned not to compete with at Gleneagles – golf and food. We have a lot of different ability and age level leagues. That's kind of the life blood of the tennis system that keeps them going and motivated."


GRAND SLAM:

"I really enjoy the status tennis has within this club. This is a sports club. Most members join Gleneagles for golf or tennis. It's really a sports facility. It's about helping those people get everything they can out of their facility. The staff here doesn't turn over too often. Our maintenance guys have been here 20 years. Astrid's been here 20 years. I've been here a long time, so it's a good home for us and the members. If you're going to come to work, you might as well have fun."

FAITH, HOPE & CHARITY: GLENEAGLES GIVES BACK

The philanthropic nature of Gleneagles members is not only inspiring but it's also deeply beneficial to the community. Here are several ways Gleneagles members are making a difference in the world:

Play For Pink

The prestigious Play For Pink event raised \$224,875 to the Breast Cancer Research Foundation, which funds breast-cancer awareness and the battle for a cure for this disease which affects about one in eight women in the United States.

With Doris Budow and Nancy Goodman as co-chairs of Play For Pink, this annual golf tournament and luncheon is a two-day event that gets hundreds of members involved annually. "We are so proud of this event. We do a Play For Pink boutique, which also raises several thousand dollars," Budow says. "Every year, it gets bigger and better and we can't wait to show you what we're doing in the upcoming year. Myra Goldman adds: "The element of charity at Gleneagles is stupendous. We do everything we possibly can to raise money for this cause."

Hadassah Genesis

This volunteer Jewish organization helps strengthen a bridge with Israel through medical, educational and community programs. Gleneagles has about 370 members, who meet monthly to raise money for the group and stay informed on newsworthy topics through guest speakers. "I have a strong feel for Israel, so being involved with this is very important to me," says Adele Albert. "Hadassah treats women, men, Jews, Muslims – everyone. They're on the cusp of discovering new things all the time. I'm hoping that working with them, eventually, we'll achieve peace." Raising more than \$40,000 a year, this chapter of Hadassah was actually the first charity group launched at Gleneagles when the community was built.

Eagles Cancer Chapter

This charitable group at Gleneagles hosts fashion shows, canasta games and boutique events to raise money for The Paps Corps, an organization devoted to cancer research. "I could cry thinking of how much this organization helps," says Sheila Yerusalim. "We even have many men involved with the cause now, which is wonderful." Lisa Hammer, who is also involved with the cause met Sheila through a game of Mahjong and the rest is history on how they got together and decided to help. "Every year we sell tributes and raise money. The Paps Corps helps research all types of cancer which is truly remarkable."

Special Olympics

Gleneagles first became involved with the Special Olympics in 1998. Because of the club's outstanding contributions, the Aquatic Center at the Club Manager's Association of America Therapeutic Recreation Complex at John Prince Park is named after the club – Gleneagles Country Club Aquatic Center.

Medical Dolls

Charity at Gleneagles also goes out to children. Several Gleneagles members meet once a week to sew dolls for kids at local children's hospitals. The dolls are then used by doctors to explain the surgery the patient is about to undergo. The dolls, which are dressed in a hospital gown and come with a hand-knit cap, do not have faces because the child is given markers to draw their own face on the doll. The patient is also given a hand-knit cap that matches their doll's cap to wear. Since many children who receive these dolls have cancer or brain surgery and lose their hair, having a cap that matches their doll's cap is very special for the child.
